COTA NT has released a Checklist for seniors signing aged care service contracts. Developed through the PICAC NT program, the Client Checklist is available in multiple languages. This initiative aims to bridge the communication gap for seniors from culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) backgrounds.

Following the successful launch of the *Service Provider Checklist*, the *Aged Care Contract Checklist* empowers clients, ensuring they fully understand their rights, responsibilities and the details of their aged care contracts.

Key Highlights of the Aged Care Contract Checklist:

1. **Practical Guide:** An easy-to-use tool simplifying contract details for providers and clients and aiding family members and caregivers in supporting their loved ones effectively.
2. **Preferred Language Support:** Encourages communication in the client's preferred language, promoting cultural sensitivity. The checklist addresses the linguistic needs of CALD seniors, making complex contract details understandable and accessible.
3. **Client Empowerment:** Enables clients to actively engage, ask questions and make informed decisions during contract signing. By outlining what to look for and what questions to ask, the checklist empowers seniors to take an active role in their aged care arrangements.
